### 15 FACTS ABOUT ENGLISH LANGUAGE...

- **★ English is the world's 3<sup>rd</sup> most spoken** language.
- There are around 360-400 million native speakers of English around the globe
- x 1.75 billion (1 in 4 people) can speak English
- 67 countries have English as an official language
- There are 12 million English teachers in the world

- There are 171,476 active, 47,156 obsolete and 9,500 derivative words in the Oxford English Dictionary
- In India, around 100 million people speak English, They earn 34% higher than their counterparts.
- 11% of the entire English Language is just the letter 'E'
- The shortest, oldest and most commonly used word is 'l'
- "I am" is the shortest complete sentence is English
- The longest English word that can be spelled without repeating any letters is uncopyrightable
- On average, approximately 1000 new words are added to the Oxford Dictionaries online every year

- English is the official language of the skies.
  Pilots speak in English on international flights
- \* 'Pneumonoultramicroscopicsilicovolcanoniosis' is the longest word refers to lung disease caused by inhaling very fine ash and sand dust.
