CLASS: IV NOUNS: <u>GENDER</u> [GRAMMAR]

There are four genders of nouns.

- 1. Masculine gender
- 2. feminine gender
- 3. Common gender
- 4. Neuter gender

# 1. MASCULINE GENDER:

The names of all male person or animals are said to be of the masculine gender as: man, boy, brother, father, uncle, king, lion, dog etc.

## 2. FEMININE GENDER:

The names of all female person or animals are said to be of the feminine gender as: girl, woman, aunt, daughter, sister, queen, niece, bitch, lioness, tigress etc.

# 3. COMMON GENDER:

The nouns that denote both males and females are said to be of the common gender as:

The word student could be a male or a female.

## **4. NEUTER GENDER:**

A non-living thing cannot be either male or female: hence, the names of such things are said to be of the neuter gender as:

house, knife, pen, chair, wood, gold, etc.

NOTE: Collective Nouns like crowd, class, army denote living beings, but these nouns are of the neuter gender.
