Ans -- **Universal adult franchise**: It provides the people with an equal chance to elect their representatives to form the government.

Equality before the law: means that every citizen of the country is equal in the eyes of the law.

Abolishment of untouchability: The Constitution of India abolishes untouchability in all its forms.

- 2) Rosa Parks become instrumental in starting the civil rights movement when one day while returning from work on a bus, she refused to give up her seat to a white man. Her denial was against the norms of that time according to which African Americans were to give their seats to white people when the bus was full.

- 3) Her refusal started the movement called the civil rights movement. The movement led to the introduction of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 which prohibited discrimination on grounds of race, religion, or national origin.
- 4. With the help of appropriate examples, explain how far you think equality has been achieved in Indian society.
- Ans -- People are forced into unequal situations, exploited, and treated unfairly on grounds of caste, class, religion, and gender.
- It is because people still consider the disadvantaged groups as inferior to them and continue to discriminate against them.
