

Verb "**do / does**"

Present Tense – do/does	Past tense- did
I <b>do</b>	I <b>did</b>
He / she / it singular subject – " <b>does</b> "	He/ she/ it – " <b>did</b> "
You/ they/ we – plural subject – " <b>do</b> "	You / we/ they – " <b>did</b> "

Eg.

- She **does** her homework every day.
- They **do** their homework every day.
- Oh, **do** come! It's going to be such fun.
- Peter **does** not work.
- I **do** like to play football.
- She **does** not waste her time.
- He **did** his homework last night.
- We **did** our homework last night.

II. To form **negative sentence** we use "not" in the sentences ( we contract the helping verb using "**n't**"):

1. I **am not** her best friend.
2. She **is not** (**isn't**) good at playing kabaddi.
3. They **are not** (**aren't**) my best friends.
4. I **have not** (**haven't**) done well in exams.
5. She **had not** (**hadn't**) shown any interest in learning new things.
6. Rahul **has not** (**hasn't**) done his homework.
7. It **was not** (**wasn't**) a faithful animal.
8. They **were not** (**weren't**) able to perform well on the stage.
9. We **do not** (**don't**) mind coming again.
10. Maya **does not** (**doesn't**) speak English well.
11. I **did not** (**didn't**) see the picture yesterday.
12. My mother **does not** (**doesn't**) let us stay up late.
13. I **do not** (**don't**) know his name.
14. He **did not** (**didn't**) come for work yesterday.
15. It **does not** (**doesn't**) matter.

III. To form **interrogative sentence**:

**Am, is, are**

1. **Am** I disturbing you?
2. **Are** you feeling well?
3. **Are** you free at 10:00 am?
4. **Is** your mother working in bank?
5. **Am** I there in the team?

**Has, have, had**

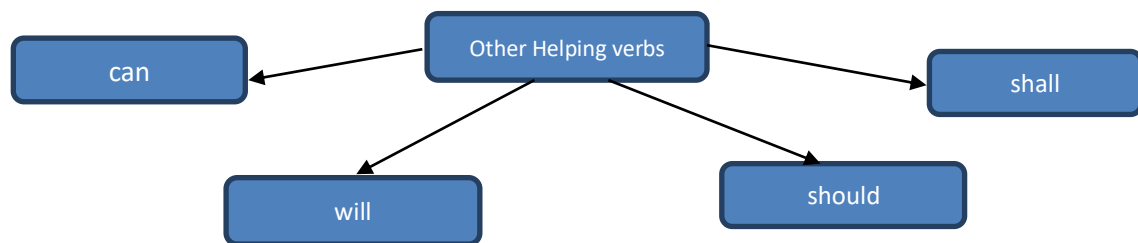
1. **Have** you done your homework?
2. **Had** she been to the market yesterday?
3. **Has** he completed his work?
4. **Have** you ever been to London?
5. **Had** I not told you to speak truth?

### Was, were

1. **Was** he present in the class last week?
2. **Were** you there for the meeting yesterday?
3. **Was** she your classmate last year?
4. **Were** they knew the results?
5. **Was** I added in the group?

### Do, does, did

1. **Do** you know him?
2. **Does** Rama study well?
3. **Do** you clean your room every day?
4. **Did** Tom feed the dog yesterday?
5. **Does** she get up early every day?



**Can be used with all singular and plural subjects.**

Examples:

- We **can** wait for them for five minutes.
- This news **will** spread soon.
- Students **shall** not enter this room.
- You **should** take rest.
- **Can** you lift this box?
- When **shall** we see you again?
- **Will** you have tea?
- Children **should** obey their parents.

Pronoun	"be" present tense	"be" past tense	has/ have	had	do /does	did
I	am	was	have	had	do	did
you	are	were	have	had	do	did
we	are	were	have	had	do	did
he/she/ it	is	was	has	had	does	did
they	are	were	have	had	do	did

the child, my mother, my book (Singular noun)	is	was	has	had	does	did
my children/ my parents (Plural noun)	are	were	have	had	do	did
