A Note from our Teacher

Never underestimate the power of a child's brain

One evening, while Arjuna was having supper, a sudden gust of wind blew out the lamp, plunging the room into darkness. Yet Arjuna continued eating his meal undeterred. He noticed his hand automatically going to his mouth, and wondered, "Why does my hand go straight to my mouth without touching my nose, cheek or chin?". After pondering for a while, he realized it was due to practice. A practice done continuously for 90 days becomes habit. From then on, Arjuna practiced archery throughout the night, without sleep and eventually became a perfect archer. He became so skilled in archery that he could perform it even in a subconscious state. Similarly, children often have hidden talents and thinking abilities within them. Our duty as a teachers is to uncover and nurture the hidden talents of out students, providing them with opportunities to practice and develop their skills.

As teachers, we should emulate Krishnas's role as a charioteer (Sarathi), guiding our students on their journey to knowledge and self-discovery. (Charioteer and monitor 4 horses (each of the horses has symbolic significance :Saibya - known for its speed and strength, symbolizing perseverance and determination. Sugriva- symbolizing agility and quickness, enabling the chariot to maneuver swiftly on the battlefield. Meghapushpa - literally meaning "cloud –colored," it symbolizes power and stability, like a gathering storm. Balahaka - represents brilliance and radiance, perhaps signifying the divine light guiding Arjuna through the darkness of battle).

So we should guide them gently, ensuring they follow the right path without feeling stressed or pressured. Every child has their own unique skills. Every child has something uniquely special that only they can do, something that sets them apart from everyone else. As an elder we need to understand the child's ability and nurture him/her accordingly. We should not compare someone to others who are not similar to them. Every flower is different and each has its own distinct fragrance. The Bible says – "God told to Moses call the skilled labor to build Tabernacle to design the vest of high priest", that means building kingdom requires skilled labor, which can only be provided by individuals uniquely gifted by God.

GP Rajratnam, a renowned teacher, would prepare himself for 45 minutes before every class, a habit he maintained until his retirement. He was always interested in teaching new concepts using innovative methods. Inspired by Swami Vivekanand's philosophy, 'Sound mind in a sound body', I strive to teach to the best of my abilities, emulating the selfless dedication of teachers and gurus who shape young minds for a brighter future".

A Glance at Learning for the Month: September

LANGUAGE AND LITERACY: We learnt '/D/d/, /G/g/, /O/o, /U/u/', sounds and words with these sounds. We also learnt many sight words. Activities: We heard story related to the sound, recited Jolly Phonic rhymes and traced in sand tray, sand paper. We also enjoyed rainbow tracing, nature walk, solving worksheet, journal writing, treasure hunt, circle the sounds in newspaper etc...







NUMERACY: We can count, quantify the numbers from 1 to 13 and learnt ordinal numbers 1st to 3rd. We can recognize the objects which are in 'circle and square'. Activities: Activities with Seguin teen board, Geometrical cabinet, counting beads, solving worksheet etc....
