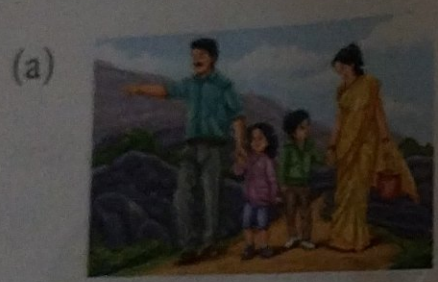

1. Write L for the activities that take a long time and S for the activities that take a short time.



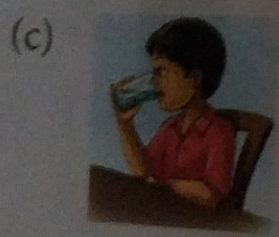

Knowledge Nugget

- Words such as '**earlier**', '**before**' and '**later**' help us distinguish between events occurring at different times.
- **Today** means the present day. **Yesterday** means the previous day. **Tomorrow** means the next day.
- The days from Monday to Friday are called **weekdays**.
- Saturday and Sunday are called **weekend**.
- A clock or watch is called **analog** if it has moving hands and hours marked from 1 to 12 to show the time.
- A clock or watch is called **digital** if it displays time digitally, that is, using numbers.
- o'clock is used after a number from one to twelve to indicate the hour of the day or night.
- Some activities take a longer time to complete than others.
