Definition of Communication: Communication is the process of conveying information, ideas, or feelings through language or other means. It involves a sender transmitting a message to a receiver, who then interprets and ideally understands it.

Example of Clear and Complete Communication: A clear and complete communication example is when a teacher provides specific instructions for an assignment, including the deadline, format, and content requirements, and the students understand and follow these instructions accurately.

Factors Affecting Communication due to Perception:

Past experiences Cultural differences Emotional state Common Body Language

Errors: Avoiding eye contact Slouching or poor posture Fidgeting

Categorization of Communication Means:

Verbal: Calling your friend, cheering for your team.

Visual: Mobile ring (as a visual notification), siren, railway signal, traffic light, zebra crossing, road signs, billboards.
