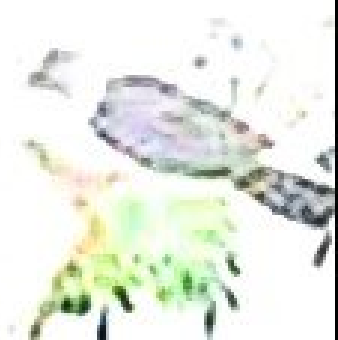
Moral: Lying breaks trust.
