## Comparisons

You must have read or heard these two rhymes.

Twinkle, twinkle, little star, How I wonder what you are, Up above the world so high, Like a diamond in the sky.



Mary had a little lamb
Whose fleece was white as snow.
And everywhere that Mary went
The lamb was sure to go.

- What is special about these lines?
  - Like a diamond in the sky

Whose fleece was white as snow

Each of these two lines compare two things.

They tell us how two things are like each other.

- The line *Like a diamond in the sky* compares a star to a diamond. It tells us that the star looks like a diamond.
- The line Whose fleece was white as snow tells us that the fleece or wool of the lamb looks white like snow. The lamb's fleece is compared to snow.
