Case Study 1: Role of Government in Health

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A small village in Madhya Pradesh had no proper healthcare facility. People had to travel more than 30 km to reach the nearest government hospital. Many villagers, due to lack of transport and money, depended on local healers. After repeated complaints, the government decided to set up a Primary Health Centre in the village. Within six months, the number of patients visiting the hospital increased, and awareness about sanitation and vaccination also improved.

Objective Questions:

1. What was the main problem faced by the villagers?
2. How far was the nearest hospital from the village?
3. What did the government establish in the village?
4. What improvements were seen after the health centre was set up?

Subjective Questions:

1. Why is it important for the government to provide healthcare facilities?
2. How can awareness about health and sanitation improve public health?

Case Study 2: How the State Government Works

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In the state of Kerala, the education department proposed a new policy to provide digital tablets to students in government schools. The proposal was discussed in the state legislative assembly. Some MLAs raised concerns about budget and implementation, while others supported it. After debate, the Chief Minister announced that the proposal would be implemented in phases with proper training for teachers.

Objective Questions:

1. Which department proposed the new policy in Kerala?

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2. What was the policy about?
3. Where was the proposal discussed?
4. What did the Chief Minister decide?

Subjective Questions:

1. Why is discussion in the assembly important for decision-making?
2. How does the role of MLAs help in forming better policies?
