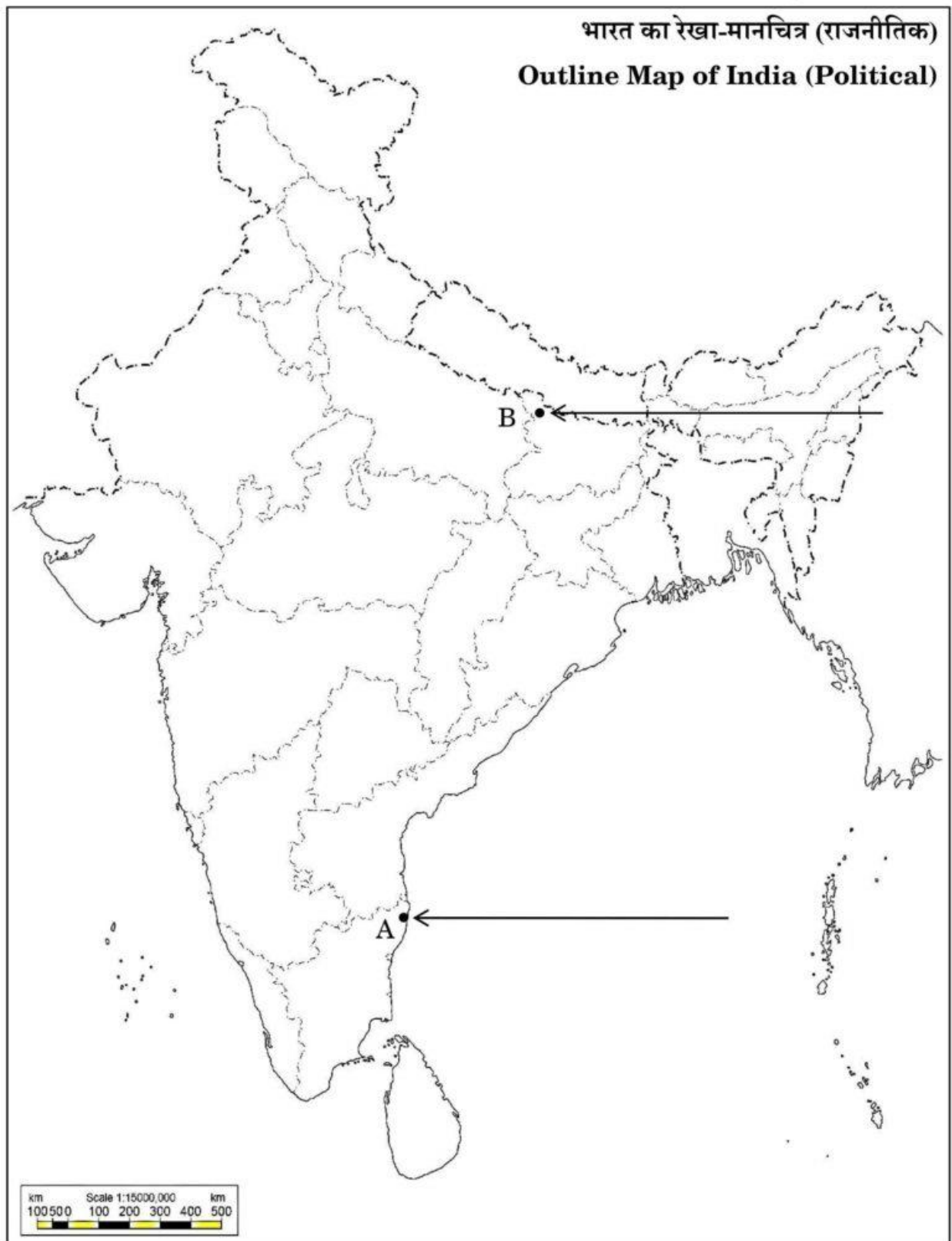

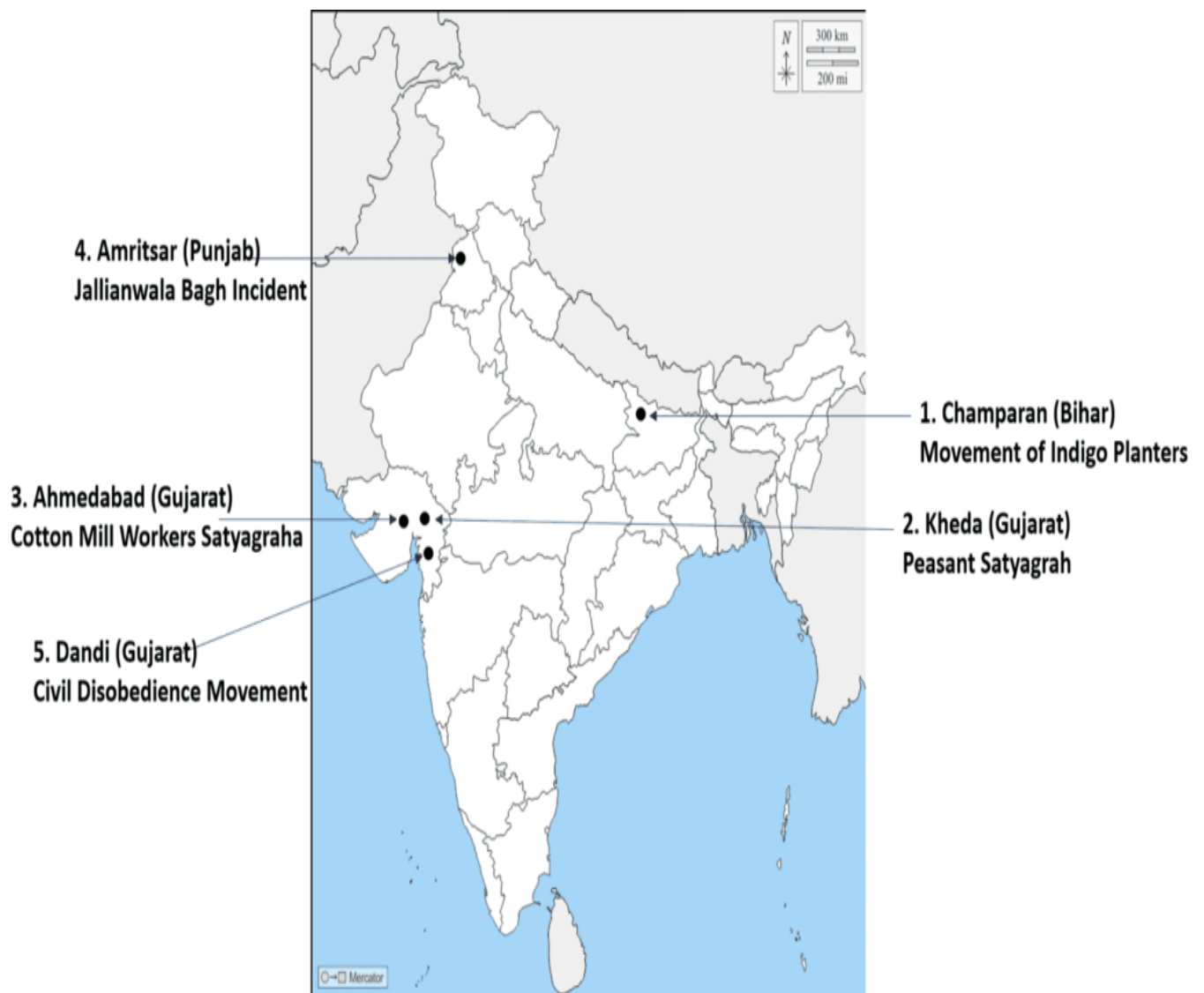

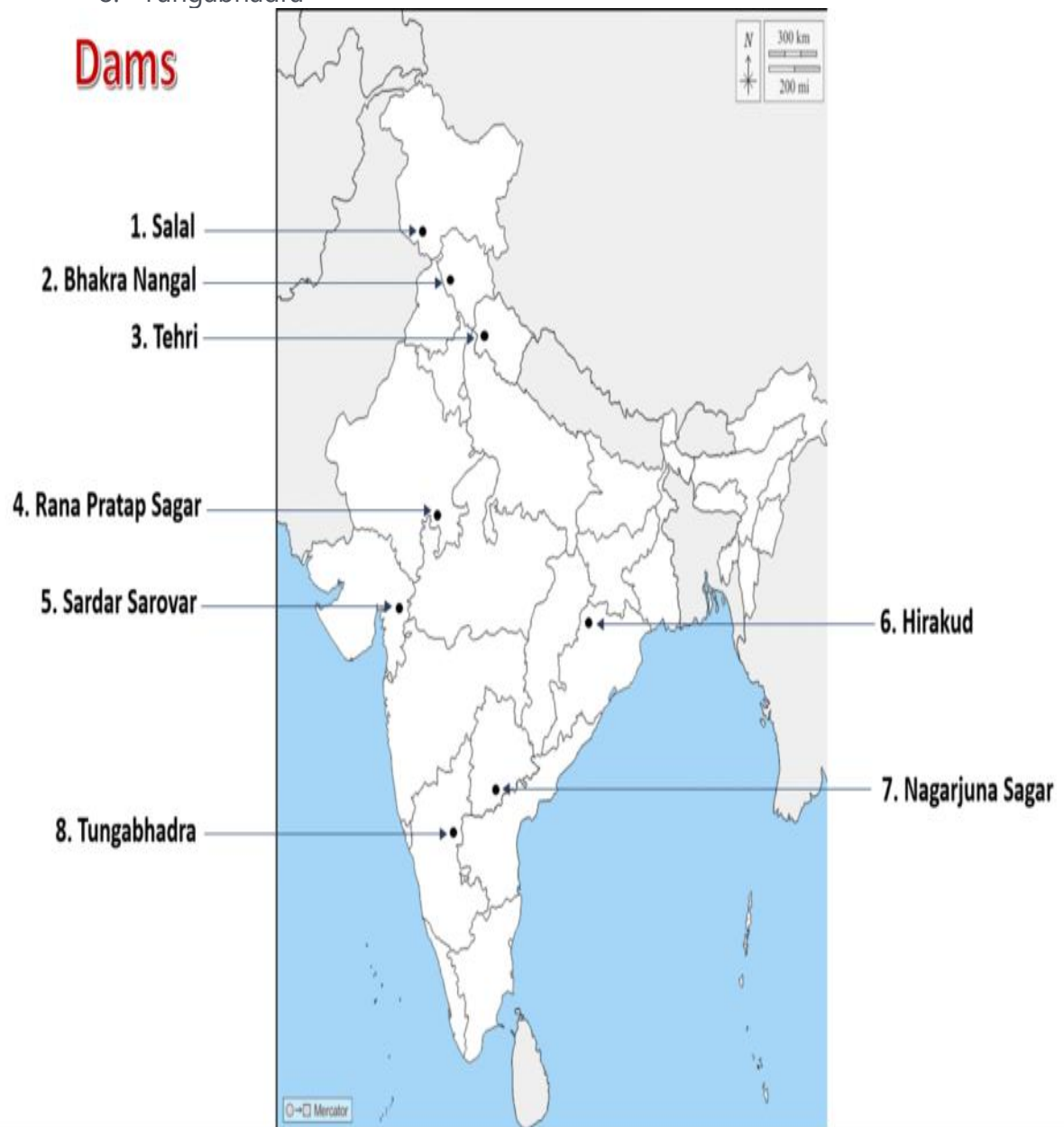

The major wheat-producing states are Punjab, Haryana, **Uttar Pradesh** (largest producer), Madhya Pradesh, and Rajasthan.

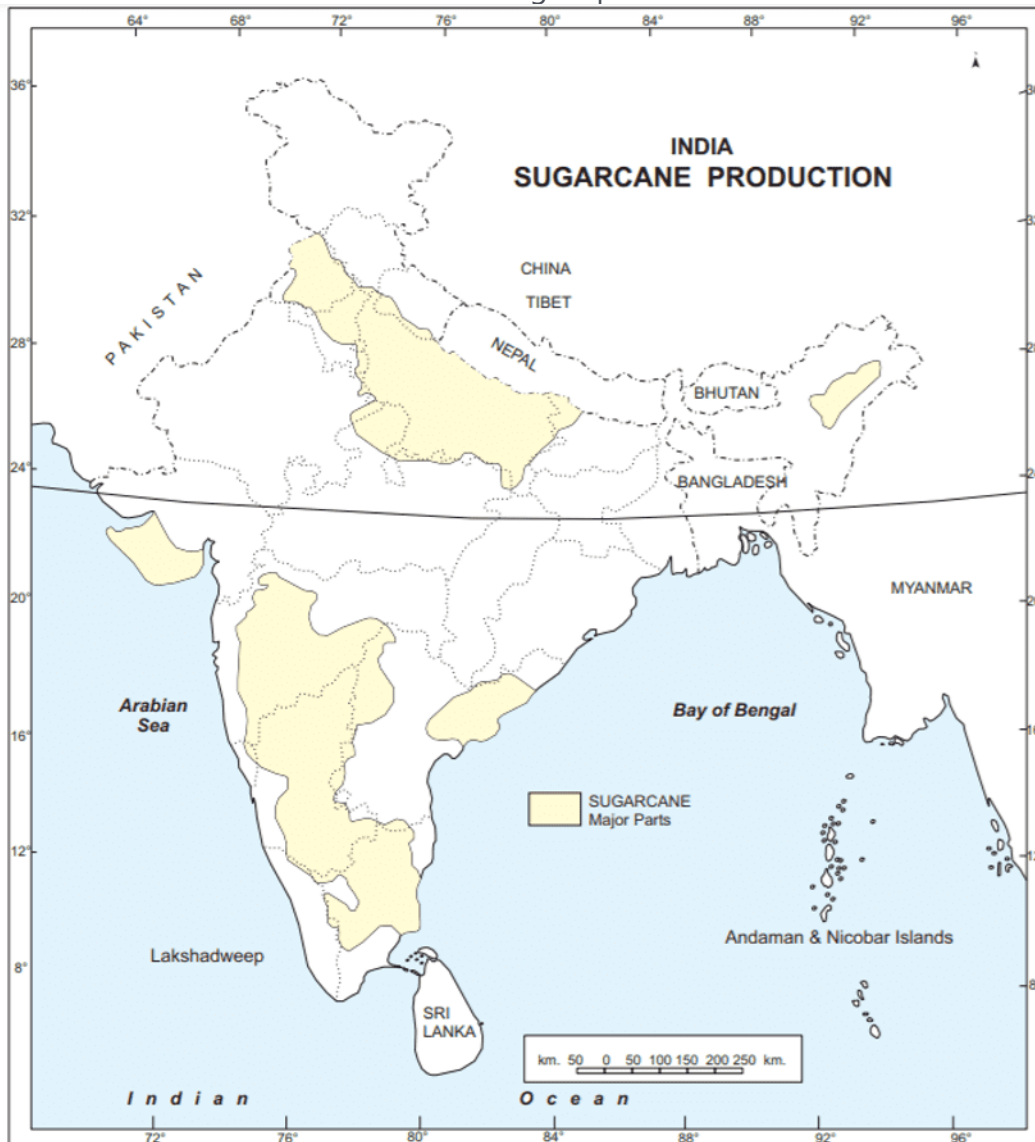


India: Distribution of Wheat

- **Maharashtra:** Second largest producer



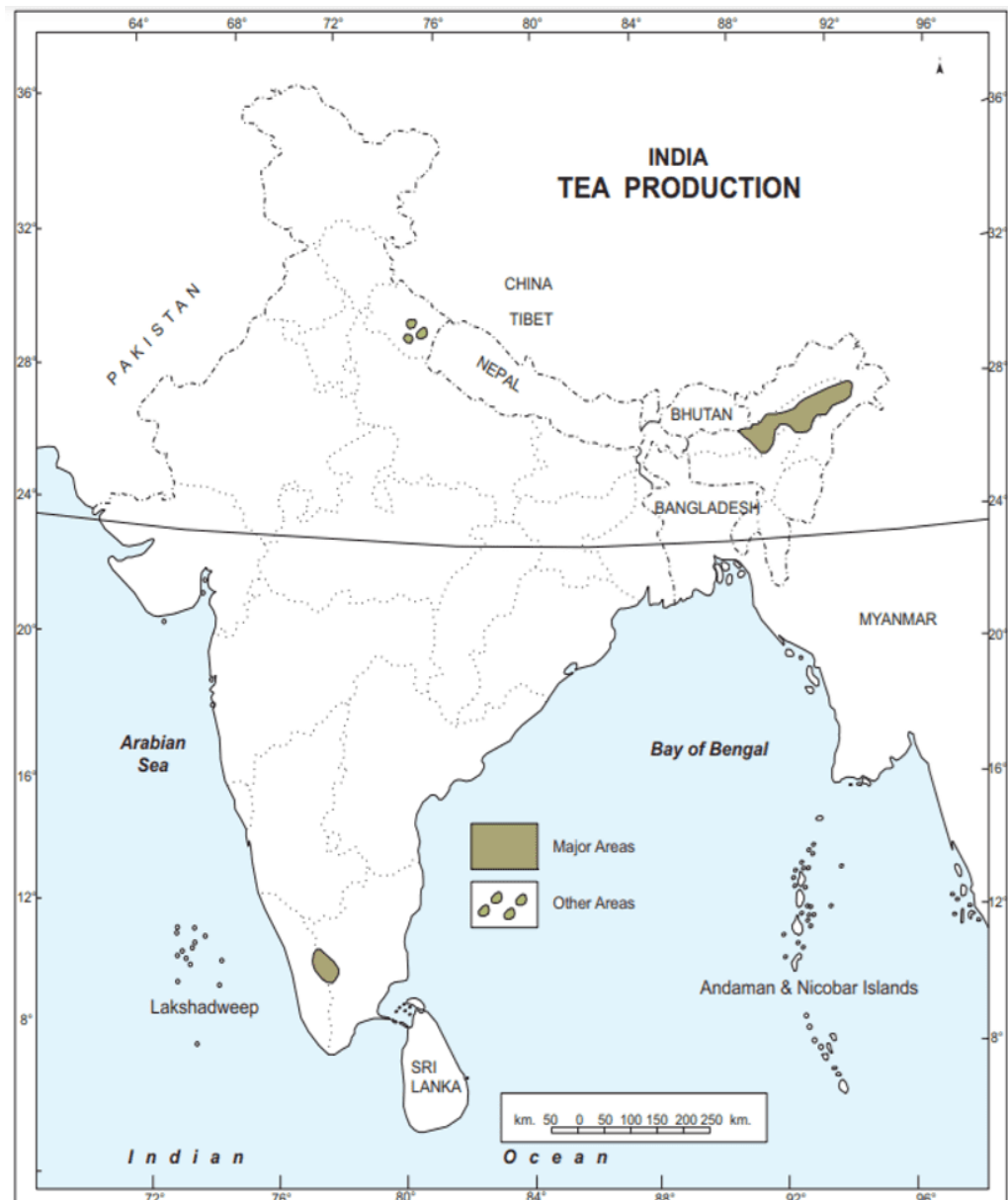

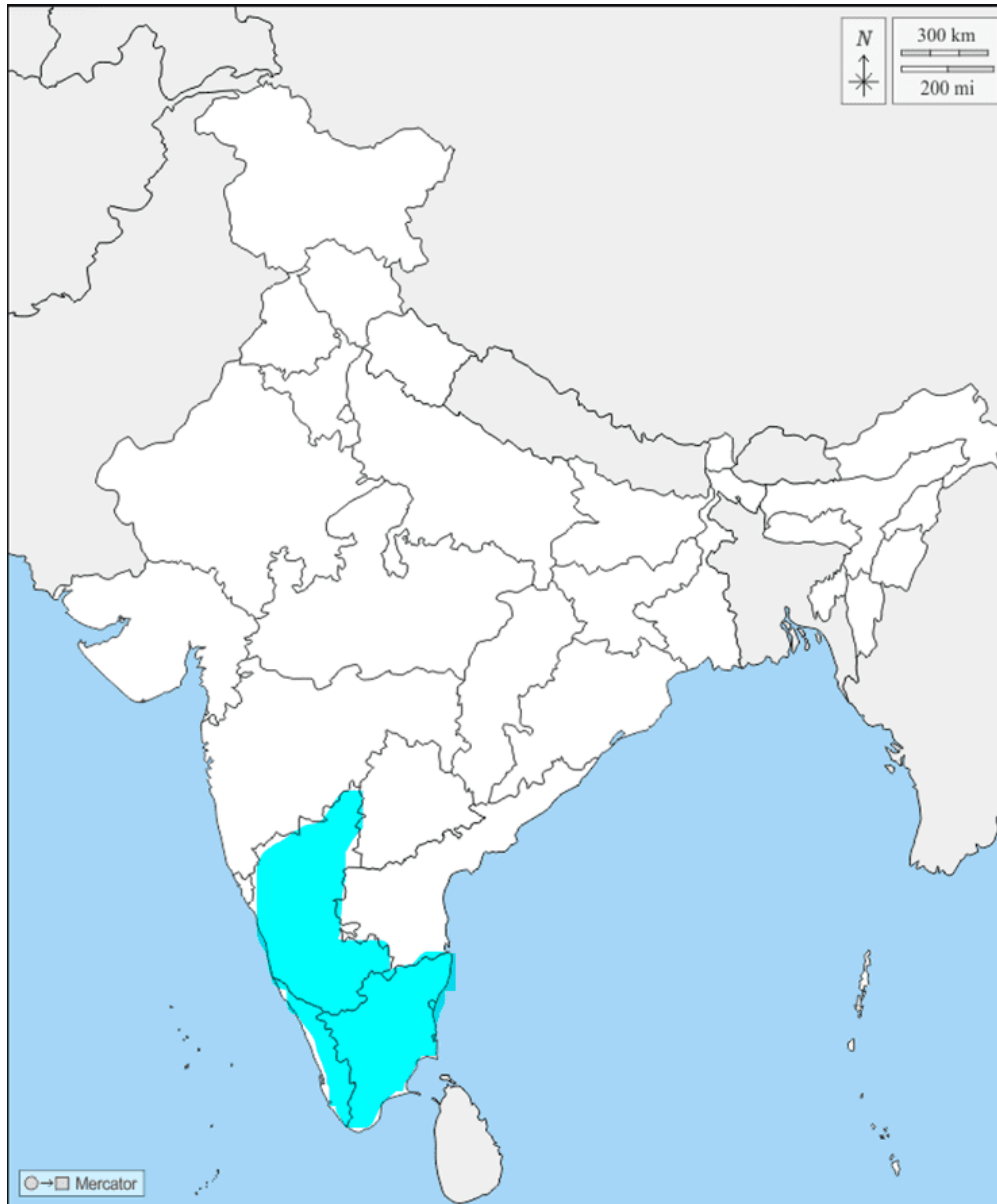

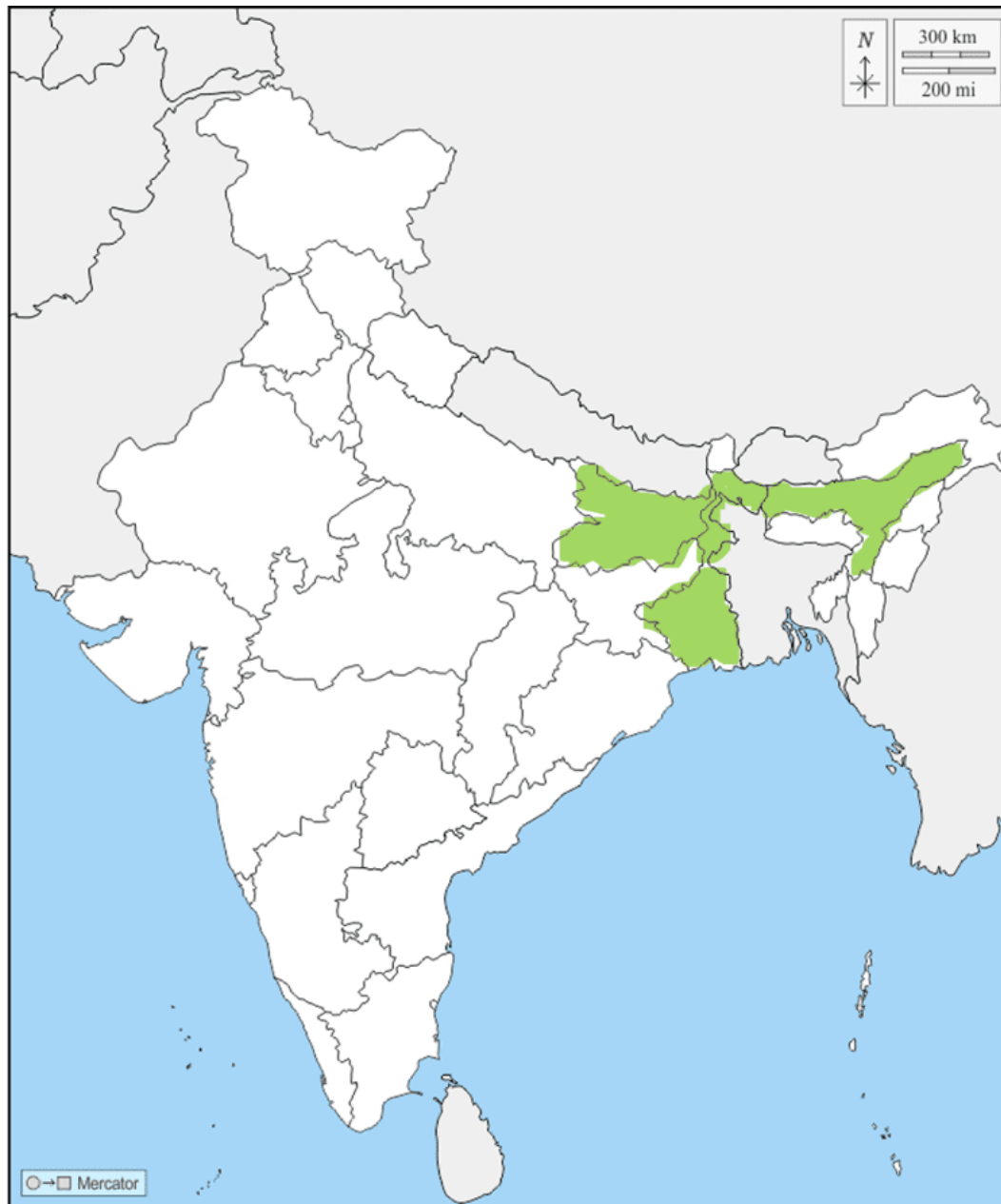
