

Dear Parents of Classes 3 to 10,

I am compelled to address a matter of growing concern that continues to disrupt the hygiene and functioning of our school facilities.

Despite repeated announcements and clear instructions to students, we are still finding leftover food and snack items being thrown into toilet bowls. This is not only highly irresponsible but also causes serious plumbing issues and creates an unsanitary environment for all. Such behaviour reflects a lack of respect for shared spaces and for the efforts of our housekeeping staff, who are struggling to manage the consequences of these actions on a daily basis.

Additionally, we have also observed cases where used sanitary napkins have been found inside flush tanks. This is deeply unhygienic and unacceptable. I urge parents, especially of our girl students, to have a direct conversation about the importance of proper menstrual hygiene and safe disposal practices. Please ensure that your child carries sanitary disposal bags and is aware of how to use them appropriately.

As a school, we consistently educate students about hygiene, responsibility, and the importance of respecting common spaces. However, without reinforcement at home, our efforts cannot be fully effective.

I sincerely request your cooperation in addressing these issues firmly with your child. These are not minor concerns — they affect the health, safety, and dignity of every student and staff member on campus. We expect our students to act responsibly and uphold the values we work so hard to instil in them.

Let us work together to create a cleaner, more respectful, and accountable school environment for everyone.
